One on One with Jacob Koszewski

JACOB KOSZEWSKI, a student at Bryant and Stratton College, is currently serving a 90 hour internship with the Brunswick Division of Police. Below, Jacob provides insight into his college work, his BDP internship, and his future plans.

WHAT INFORMATION CAN YOU PROVIDE ON YOUR COURSE OF STUDY AT BRYANT AND STRATTON?

The course that I am currently studying is Criminal Justice at the Associates Level. In order to obtain an Associate's Degree of Applied Science of Criminal Justice a student must complete a 16 month (4 semesters) study program. There are many courses that pertain to the Criminal Justice fields. For example corrections, policing, criminal courts, criminal law, criminal procedure, interviewing practices and theory, juvenile justice, criminology, and criminal investigations are just a few that I am taking or have completed.

WHY DID YOU CHOOSE THIS PROGRAM?

I chose this program due to the

experience I developed during my deployment in Operation Iraqi Freedom, from December of 2007 through February 2009.

WHAT DID YOU DO DURING YOUR MILITARY EXPERIENCE?

While I was in the service I was charged as a sniper and finished as a sniper team leader. I moved from the rank of E-1(private) to the rank of E-5(sergeant). While deployed, I was attached to 1-21 recon platoon 25th infantry division. While in the platoon, I help planned, execute and train for the capturing of High Value Targets within our area of operations. I was also tasked with route security, counter sniper operations, and people of importance (high ranking officers) security.

WHAT ARE YOUR CAREER GOALS?

My career goals are to obtain a bachelor degree in Criminal Justice and then move on to become an employee of a federal agency.

WHAT ARE THE REQUIRMENTS OF YOUR INTERNSHIP WITH THE BDP?

I am required to serve 90 hours to gain experience and knowledge in the policing aspect of the criminal justice community.

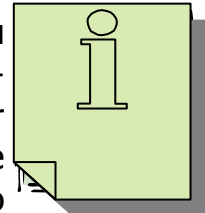
WHAT INTERNSHIP EXPERIENCES HAVE YOU HAD TO DATE?

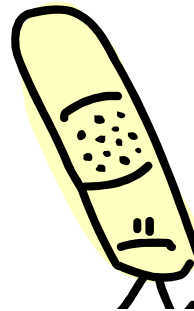

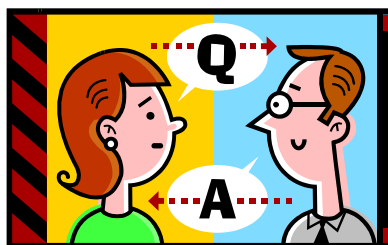
MEETING UPDATE

Board Meeting Minutes February 17, 2011

Wendy Linderman began her term as the newly elected President of the BCPAAA by opening the meeting at 7:00 p.m. and, then, welcoming the new Board members.

Items that were covered at this Board meeting attend by all Board members and Phil Frate include the following:

- ◆ Treasurer, Evelyn Cyz reported that there is \$841.38 in the treasury and that 16 members have paid their 2011 dues.
- ◆ Dave Linderman voted to suspend the reading of the February 17, 2011 minutes; Vicky Kirkpatrick seconded.
- ◆ Proper Board etiquette including the use of e-mail, confidentiality, etc. was covered.
- ◆ Sue Esker requested input on possible dates for 2011 Shredding Day events. Bob Wasil, Karen Nelson, & Millie Manning will help w/ the planning & implementation. Specific info will be provided as soon as possible.
- ◆ Wendy Linderman updated on Project Lifesaver.
- ◆ Vicky Kirkpatrick gave a FACT report. She informed the group that there may be possible volunteer opportunities with FACT. She also stated that there will be a FACT legal clinic on March 2 from 6-8 p.m.
